Community and Mental Health Services

- Formed in 2001
- Partnership between Crosby Housing Association and Mersey Care NHS Trust with funding via Sefton MBC and South Sefton CCG.
- Work is focused on the accommodation and support needs of people in Sefton who are open to secondary mental health services. This includes short term tenancy support.

- Managerial oversight provided by Mersey Care via direct managerial support from HUB Manager.
- Team is based in CHA main office.

What does CHART do?



Community and Mental Health Services

- Avoid a hospital admission
- Decrease the length of a hospital stay
- Decrease the risk of mental health deterioration related to housing instability
 - Prevent homelessness
 - Tenancy support
 - Housing options guidance and support

- 284 = the total number of referrals to CHART for the year
- 54% = totally new referrals (same as last year)
- 46% = re-referrals
