The Noise App Simplify noise nuisance reporting and investigation Overview



Efficient Handling

Noise reports will be submitted to the website which will notify the investigating officer via email

The investigating officer can update the progress of the case and message the app user

Audio files and case details are securely stored online and can be exported from the website

Professional Collaboration

Share recordings through our secure database with other authorised professionals when tackling anti-social behaviour

Share audio files with perpetrators to inform mediation dialogue and assist dispute resolution

The Noise App Simplify noise nuisance reporting and investigation Data Security



Validation and Continuity of Evidence

All recordings are removed from a user's device once the case has been submitted

Only authorised persons on The Noise App website can access recordings

Removing the audio files from a user's device prevents against evidence tampering, unauthorised distribution and playback

Protect Against False Reporting

Users register and agree to 'Conditions of Reasonable Use'

GPS is enabled for cross-checking

Users are unable to leave their device recording for long periods of time in a remote location

Blacklisting prevents users abusing the reporting system

Issued The Nosie App for a report of shouting.

Listened to recordings and gained permission from the complainant.

Spoke directly to the perpetrator

Used evidence in mediation

Complainant admitted she did make the noise and would reduce moving forward.

The context: deficit challenge

Disadvantaged Communities

- Lack of sport and physical activity infrastructure
- Higher crime and anti-social behaviour
- Economic inactivity/low skills
- Poor educational attainment
- Poor health outcomes
- Low civic engagement and lack of volunteering opportunities
- £3.21 a week family spend on sport

Disadvantaged Individuals

- Few positive opportunities, including able to volunteer
- Low self-esteem/selfconfidence/resilience
- Lack of parental/family support
- Limited disposable income
- Lack of role models
- Double jeopardy for girls, BME, disability
- Lower attainment

















Our development approach The policy cycle

INSIGHT

Once approaches are tested then We replicate by:

- Playing into other sectors.


